

NTMWD Board of Directors Elect Officers for 2005-2006

NTMWD Board of Directors elected executive officers for the upcoming 2005-06 term which begins with the June board meeting.

Elected to serve as president is Director Jerry Yancey, who serves as one of two directors from the City of Plano. Yancey has served six consecutive years on the board and has held the role of vice president and secretary. Director Yancey has served on the Wastewater, Solid Waste, Insurance, Personnel, Legislative and Policy Committees.

Ken Bell, appointed to the NTMWD Board of Directors by the City of Richardson in 1995, will serve as vice president. Director

Bell served as secretary this past executive term. Bell has served on the Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste, Personnel, Finance/Audit, and the Policy Committees.

Elected to serve as secretary to the executive board is City of Farmersville representative Bill Harrison. This will be the first executive office held by Harrison since his appointment in 1998. Harrison has served on the Water, Wastewater, Insurance and the Policy Committees.

Outgoing officers are Dr. Joe Farmer, President, Allen; Jerry Yancey, secretary, Plano; and Ken Bell, Secretary, Richardson.

NTMWD Trivia:

Director Alex R. Schell, III has served on the NTMWD Board of Directors for 41 years, being appointed by the City of Plano in 1964. Director Schell replaced his father on the NTMWD Board, Alex R. Schell, Jr., who served 13 consecutive years from 1951-1964.

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Eleven NTMWD Wastewater Facilities Receive Peak Performance Awards

NTMWD's wastewater treatment facilities have been selected to receive Gold and Silver Peak Performance Awards. The Peak Performance Awards program presented by the National Association of Clean Water Agencies (NACWA) recognizes public wastewater treatment facilities for their outstanding compliance records in the 2004 calendar year. NACWA, formally known as Association of Metropolitan Sewerage Agencies (AMSA), was proud to recognize over 300 Peak Performance Award facilities during the Association's 35th Anniversary Annual Meeting held in May.

NACWA's Peak Performance Awards provide well-deserved recognition to individual NACWA member agency facilities for outstanding compliance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit limits. NTMWD received a total of eleven Peak Performance Awards of which five have received Gold Awards and six received Silver Awards.

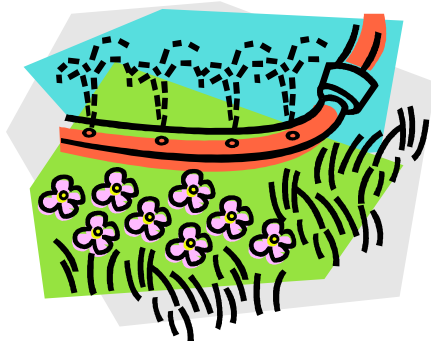
Gold Awards are presented to treatment plants that have achieved 100 percent compliance with their NPDES permit for an entire calendar year. NTMWD wastewater treatment

plants receiving Gold Awards are: Cottonwood Creek WWTP, Terry Lane WWTP, Buffalo Creek WWTP, Floyd Branch Regional WWTP, and South Mesquite Creek Regional WWTP. Of these wastewater plants, Terry Lane and Cottonwood, have received Gold Awards for three consecutive years.

Silver Awards recognize facilities that have received no more than five NPDES permit violations per calendar year. NTMWD wastewater treatment plants receiving Silver Awards are: Farmersville WWTP #2, Royse City WWTP, Rush Creek WWTP, Seis Lagos WWTP, Squabble Creek WWTP, and Stewart Creek West Regional WWTP.

"NACWA is honored to showcase the achievements of the NTMWD and our nation's public wastewater utilities through the Peak Performance Awards Program," said Ken Kirk, NACWA's Executive Director.
