

### **CMAR 1 – Dam and Intake Structure**

- BDL Dam
  - Improved vegetation
  - Energized power supply
- Lake Bonham Dam
  - Improved vegetation
- Lake Elevation 518.30 46% full (December 9th)
- Final Completion:
  - Completing punch list items
  - Fine grading emergency spillway
  - Vegetation growth 80% coverage

## **Mitigation Property**

- Builder's risk Insurance
  - Builder's Risk insurance no longer available after construction
  - RES offered to substitute property insurance
  - Property insurance for plantings not readily available
  - Engaged NTMWD's insurance carrier & Mark Walsh
- Applications for Growing Season Payments/Payment and Performance Bonds
  - Transition to Lake Operations October 2022
  - RES can request Growing Season payments only in December of each year
  - Payment and performance bonds renewed each year





## **CWA 404 Permit Compliance (continues for 20 years)**

- Mitigation Reports submitted annually on December 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Transition to Lake Operations
  - Project Completion February 2023
  - Mitigation Monitoring Report from RES submitted December 1, 2022
  - Permit Special Condition Compliance 13 special conditions
    - 7 complete; 6 in progress (including Cultural Resources)

#### Cultural Resources

- Transition to NTMWD's Permitting Department
- Five Texas Antiquities Permits (TAP) Open
- All chapters of all reports reviewed and approved by THC & USACE
- Curate hundreds of thousands of artifacts and support documents
- Close last TAP before 1/22/2029
- Re-inter Ancestral Caddo Remains 2028



## **Treated Water Pipeline Disinfection**


- TCEQ References AWWA Standard C-651
  - Considerations for pipeline chlorination
    - Volume of chlorinated water needing dechlorination
      - Chlorinated water may not be discharged to the environment w/out dechlorination
    - Flushing velocity 3 feet/second (75 million gallons/day flowrate in 84-in diameter pipe)
    - Three times the pipe volume before sampling (108 million gallons)
  - Optimize timing between pipeline disinfection and TCEQ approval of Leonard WTP





## **Startup and Testing**

- Raw Water Pump Station
  - Successfully completed Uncoupled and Coupled testing
  - Working on resolving issues encountered during testing procedure
  - Readiness to Operate in full









## **Startup and Testing**

- High Service Pump Station
  - Uncoupled testing on-going
  - Preparing temporary piping to start Coupled testing of the pumps – January

## **Regulatory Update**

# NTMWD prepared and submitted plan to TCEQ for regulatory compliance steps for the complete new system:

- ✓ Received new PWS number
- ✓ BDL is approved and registered as a new potable water source in the State
- ✓ CT Study for disinfection process is approved

# CMAR, Engineer and NTMWD collected data and assembled STEP - 2 Submittal after Leonard WTP 100-hr run:

- ✓ Water Quality samples, and Laboratory reports
- ✓ Operators Certifications and training on all chemical facilities and handling
- ✓ Risk Management Plan and Process Hazard Analysis submitted to EPA





## **Executive Session**





#### **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

### **Section 551.071, Consultation with Attorney**

- Authorizes a government body to consult with its attorney in an Executive Session to seek advice on legal matters regarding pending or contemplated litigation or a settlement offer.
- A government body may not invoke this Section to convene a closed session and then discuss matters outside of that provision.
- General discussion of policy, unrelated to legal matters, is not permitted under the language merely because an attorney is present.
- Items discussed during consultation with the District's attorney are privileged and should remain confidential

## Section 551.072, Deliberations about Real Property

- Authorizes a government body to deliberate in Executive Session on certain matters concerning real property.
- It provides as follows:
  - A governmental body may conduct a closed meeting to deliberate the purchase, exchange, lease, or value of real property if deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the governmental body in negotiations with a third person.
- Items discussed during Executive Session are privileged and should remain confidential.



  - Consider authorizing a budget amendment in the amount of \$200,000 for the replacement of a 36-inch valve within the Plano Water Transmission Facilities System





Pipeline Relocations at U.S. 380, FM 741 and FM 1641 Project No. 101-0619-22 Administrative Memorandum No. 5881









#### **WASTEWATER AGENDA ITEMS**

- D. Authorize Amendment No. 2 to the Construction Manager At-Risk (CMAR) agreement for the South Mesquite Creek Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant (RWWTP) Peak Flow Management and Expansion project Administrative Memorandum No. 5882
  - Consider authorizing the Executive Director to execute the second amendment to the CMAR agreement with Archer Western Construction, LLC in the amount of \$8,556,427.36 for partial Guaranteed Maximum Price No. 2 for construction of work packages including early peak relief construction for Project No. 301-0525-18, South Mesquite Creek Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant Peak Flow Management and Expansion
